## Restoring Broken Things

I am in love...with a dog. Many of you have met Baxter the loveable lab so this is no big surprise. I'm admittedly not a "pet person." Never have been. Never will be, but I love that dog. Even my mother, who is closer to the pet-hater end of the scale than the pet-lover end, loves that dog. (She never calls to check on me but she does call to check on Baxter.)

You know it is love when you wake up in the middle of the night to the sound of a puking dog and your first thought is "poor dog," not "poor carpet." And we've been waking up to that sound more often lately.

We think poor Baxter had a stroke and that, combined with very bad arthritis, makes for one pathetic dog. He moves around the house with cracking joints and heavy sighs like a 90-year old man. He can't do the stairs, he can't eat out of his dish, and he can't keep his pills down. Even wagging that big tail of his can cause destabilization and a tumble. Pathetic.

It's hard to watch a loved one suffer. Even if it is a dog. (Now stay with me on this one...) I think about days when things were different. That tail-wagging fanatic meeting me at the door after a hard day, long walks with Mary and Baxter in the cool of the night, spending my day off with a dog as my assistant and companion. (I told you, I love that dog.)

Now it feels like something is broken. Even if it is just a dog dealing with old age. Something needs to be restored. Something needs to be fixed.

Use this as a metaphor for other broken things, Bigger things. Broken hearts and broken lives. Broken things we long to see restored; maybe even become desperate to see restored.

Broken families— Husbands and wives alienated. Children and parents at odds. Brothers and sisters who refuse to talk with each other. Homes ripped apart by abuse, loneliness, or alienation.

Broken societies—Crime. Hunger. Injustice, Poverty. Disease. Greed. Abortion. Pornography. Pollution. Addiction. War. Hatred. Prejudice. Discrimination.

Broken Churches—Failure to reconcile. Gossip. Bitterness. Factions. Disunity. Lack of compassion. Failure of heart and vision.

Broken people—Dysfunction. Loneliness. Depression. Heartache. Injury. Sloth. Sickness. Anger. Cancer. Lust. Pride. Death. Selfishness. Pain. Hopelessness. Grief.



I could go on and on describing the brokenness in this world – including my poor, pathetic puppy. The Bible talks about the whole world groaning as it longs for restoration. I could not help but think of that while listening to my beloved Baxter groan as he tries to find a pain-free position to rest his aching body.

Our vision of God's kingdom is all about restoring broken things— setting right all that has gone wrong, and bringing about this restoration here and now, realizing that Jesus

really does care to restore what is broken in this world and in our lives.

Jesus made this promise in Revelation 21:5 – "Behold I make all things new."

That is good news in a broken world. This is the good news that transforms each of our stories – Jesus redeems, Jesus renews, and Jesus restores.

That should make your tail wag.

## Care 101

Mucking basements, washing dirty clothes for someone you don't know, preparing meals for strangers, tearing up floors, carrying boxes filled with wet possessions up narrow staircases and then putting them on the curb to be picked up: for three months now this has been the agenda which many of our members have been following.

Soon these tasks will be remembrances of how we responded to the Floods of 2008. Much has been written about the way Cedar Hills Community Church rose to new heights of Christ-like behavior. In word, in print, and in conversations, stories of unselfish deeds were shared. In one word, OUTSTANDING was the response of the congregation.

There is a new opportunity approaching and it is my prayer that we will respond with the same energy and enthusiasm as we have with the Floods of 2008.

It is CARE 101. What is the situation? There are literally hundreds of individuals in our congregation and in the neighborhood surrounding our Church who need to be reached with the healing love of Christ. These individuals may be in the hospital. They may be in nursing homes. They may be in the camp grounds at Morgan Creek Park. They may be on your street. ## Belhar Confession

In 2000, the General Synod of the Reformed Church in America invited its members and congregations to a decade of study and reflection on the Belhar Confession, a document of the Christian Church in South Africa. This confession was written out of the struggle against apartheid. In 2007, the Belhar was provisionally adapted for two years. As such, it can be used in worship, teaching, discernment, and confession. The next General Synod will consider it for full approval.

You might ask, "What is a confession?" The Holy Scriptures are the only rule of faith and practice in the RCA. However, we do have Doctrinal Standards (the Belgic Confession of Faith, the Heidelberg Catechism, and the Canons of the Synod of Dort) which present the primary beliefs in a systematic fashion. A confession of faith is a formal statement that speaks internally to the church, but also externally to the world so loved by God. It tells the world that Jesus Christ is Lord and helps the church articulate its mission and witness.

The Belhar presents three themes:

- 1)Unity as a gift of God and as obligation for the church;
- 2)Reconciliation as the God-entrusted message to the church, called to be a peacemaker; and
- 3)Justice as the revealed nature of God that calls the church to stand by people in any form of suffering.

Those themes are contemporary and not fully addressed in the three confessions (doctrinal standards) that were first adopted in the 16th and 17th centuries. If adopted, this confession may further proclaim the RCA vision of being a church that is called by God to stand where God stands with the poor, a church that is racially and socially inclusive, a church healing brokenness and transforming lives by the love of Jesus Christ.

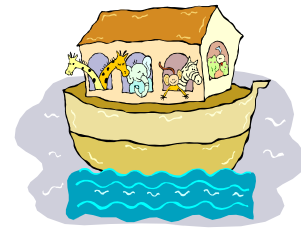

## Ministry Management Team

The purpose of the ministry management team is to create an environment for healthy ministry. This team is made up of representatives of the elders, deacons, staff, and each core team. Our team-based ministry structure allows Ministry Management to act as a hub through which all parts of the structure run to facilitate good communication, avoid any duplication, and remove any roadblocks that may occur.

Every month each core team leader gives us a report from their core teams, and we are usually blown away by all the neat stuff that each team is doing. As someone so aptly said, "The King is on the move." As we heard about many opportunities for service in our community, we reflected on how God has used this recent disaster to move us forward in our mission efforts.

A large portion of the meeting was spent dealing with team budgets for 2009. A few adjustments were made and the ministry team portion of the budget was sent back to the Asset Management Team. The Worship Core Team provided information about the new format for announcements on Sunday mornings. The change to having all announcements done before the prelude was made so that worship remains worship.
