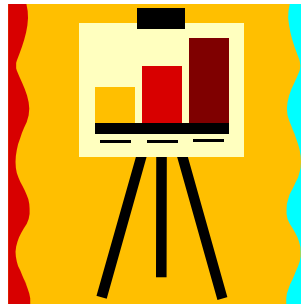

Reflecting with Kent . . .

Question...how are we doing?

I mean as a congregation, how are we doing in carrying out our mission of sharing God's love with a needy world? How are we doing in bringing people to faith in Jesus Christ? How are we doing in making disciples? How are we doing?



A recent study involving over 200 congregations asked more than 80,000 adult followers of Christ how they were doing in living out their faith. This study—called **Reveal** – offered some interesting insights. They have helped me get a clearer picture of how we are doing as a congregation.

Insight #1: People who are exploring faith, or are new in faith grow most in worship services. When worship includes transformational teaching about Christian fundamentals, those who are new in faith grow by leaps and bounds.

Insight #2: People who are growing in faith grow most from the practice of reflecting on Scripture. Regular personal study of, and meditation on, the Bible is by far the most important element for those who want to be more like Christ.

Insight #3: For those who are mature in their faith, the most important element of growth comes from serving others. Those who live Christ-centered lives naturally love and serve others.

On a personal level, where are you? New, growing, or maturing in faith? Are you involved in the practices that help you grow the most spiritually? How are you doing?

On a congregational level, how are we doing? I am encouraged because three of our staff are already engaged in developing the vital areas mentioned above. Leah focuses a significant amount of time and energy cultivating rich worship; as Pastor of Discipleship Todd devotes a chunk of his time to developing opportunities for adults to engage in Biblical reflection; and Marie's job is all about getting people into the right place of service. I am encouraged that we have good people and good teams already focusing on the key areas of growth identified in the **Reveal** study.

God is opening doors of opportunity to lead us to new levels of making disciples. I have never been more excited about how we are doing as a congregation—or what is coming. Please join me in praying for God's guidance as we pursue the mission God has for CHCC.

Consistory News and Notes

We started our May meeting by looking at Proverbs 29:18 – **Without a vision the people perish**. Discussion followed about the vital importance of a clear compelling vision.

We discussed our 2009 goal of improved communication. We determined that we already have excellent policies and procedures in place, but that we need to work on consistent implementation. We agreed to review our policy book, to identify next steps, make sure we name who has agreed to take the lead with each step, and then focus on the follow-through of each step.

We discussed our nomination process. We agreed with the study team's recommendations that we continue with the double slate for 2009 because we are out of time to make a switch this year. We agreed to rework the current policy by eliminating the requirement that a person who receives three nominations must be included on the ballot. We also approved the recommendation that empowers the nominating committee to research the qualifications of each individual nominated with an eye toward their commitment to Christ, their spiritual gifts of

leadership and discernment, their current involvement level in the church, and their willingness to serve.

The elders reported that they will be taking up an in-depth study of conflict resolution. Our hope is to create an atmosphere of proactive response around issues of interpersonal conflict seeking restoration and health.

We approved the Asset Management Team's request to refinance our building loan to get a better interest rate.

Pastor Kent will be attending the General Synod of the Reformed Church in America, June 4-10.

CHCC on a Mission: Six Key Values:

1. We will be a community of believers devoted to the **Great Commandment** found in **Matthew 22:37-40**. We will love God and love each other.

High Impact Church

One of the books the Church Multiplication Team is reading is titled **High Impact Church Planting**. Dr. John Jackson defines these churches this way: **High impact churches break through spiritual, social, and leadership barriers to establish new churches, new ministries, and reach large numbers of new people for Christ.**

As I read the book I wondered if CHCC is a high impact church. Some of the key concepts he discusses are these:

- 1.High impact churches start with a God-sized dream.
- 2.High impact church leaders are catalyts.
- 3.High impact churches are built with people who are willing to sacrifice.
- 4.High impact leadership teams should have a broad focus and varied expertise.
- 5.Vision drives high impact churches.
- 6.Prayer must cover each aspect of a high impact ministry.
- 7.Leaders of high impact ministries are faith-filled.
- 8.High impact churches challenge and break barriers.
- 9.High impact churches begin with the end in mind.

Have you ever dreamed of partnering with God to start a new ministry or a new church with high impact?

How has God's wisdom illuminated/transformed your life?

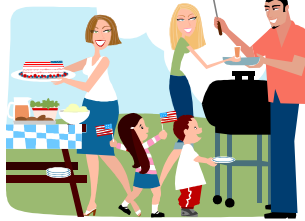
Pray

Ministry Spotlight: Life Groups

Life Groups are “close-knit, life transforming communities that help their members grown in love and faith.” So what does that mean to the average CHCC member?

Our church has grown significantly over the past four years and sometimes seeing all those people in the MPR on Sunday morning can be a bit daunting when it comes to feeling like you “belong.”

Being part of a Life Group, which usually has 10-14 members, gives you a group of people with which you can create a tighter relationship. “The support from my Life Group has been amazing.”

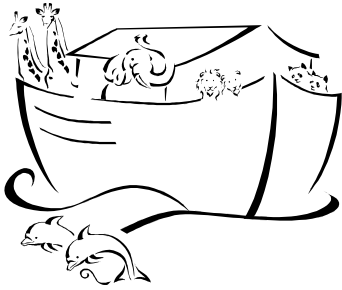
“Our kids can't wait for Life Group gatherings so they can play together.”

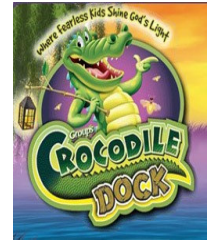
Children's Ministries

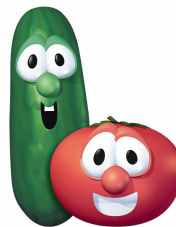

Sr. High Youth Ministry

The 30 Hour Famine is almost here. The students have been busy preparing for this overnight event and we know that God will bless us. We know that it will be a huge success again this year and look forward to the impact that God will have on all of us.

The 30 Hour Famine's goal is to give students and adults the chance to experience hunger and to make a difference in the lives of others. The theme this year is Will Starve for Food. Through the actions of our students and many others all over the country, millions of dollars have been raised to help people in poverty. The guiding verse for this year's famine is Isaiah 58:10 – *Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble. Then your light will shine out from the darkness.*

The Sr. High youth set a God-sized goal this year of raising \$6000. Part of the money that we raise will be used for our service project which will be done Saturday morning during The Famine. This year, we will again be working with Kids Against Hunger. KAH is an amazing organization that goes around to organizations and sets up meal-making lines. Each line takes a group of people to add ingredients that make up a dry goods meal that is packaged and shipped to hungry people all over the world. Each meal is fortified with a special mix of vitamins that people in a starvation situation can digest easily. These meals then feed a family of six and only cost \$1.50. Our goal is to make 1200 meals that will feed 7200 people!

We want to invite the congregation to partner with us as we work towards our \$6000 goal. We want to say a huge thank you for everyone who's contributed already. Do you want to help us reach our goal? There are two ways that you can still support our efforts. Check out our Famine Table in the Gathering Space and see how much has been raised already and make a donation. On June 7th, we will be hosting a pancake breakfast to raise money for our goal. Consider eating some pancakes with us and make a donation.

Worship Ministries

Did you know your voice carries authority? In the same way God's voice carried authority when He spoke creation into being, our voices are made with an authority beyond that of our own doing. God didn't 'think' creation into being, or 'build' creation into being, but He *spoke* creation into being. Our voices have a built-in authority to them that is powerfully released when we use them in worship and prayer. Perhaps this is one of the reasons we sing or speak aloud responsive readings. Perhaps this is a reason the Scripture for each Sunday is read aloud. There is something about using our voices to speak Truth into our lives. Faith comes by hearing. Sometimes faith comes in hearing your own voice.

I was at a prayer service lately when the leader kept saying, "Find your prayer voice!" What he meant was to stop thinking prayers and praises in my head, but to use the authority given to me in my voice to speak them aloud. I witnessed an entire room filled with voices of believers saying, "Thank you, Lord. I love you, Lord. Hallelujah. Jesus is Lord. You are my all in all..." You could feel the entire climate of the room shift from emptiness to joy. There is something unique about lifting up our voices to the Lord. In fact, the Psalms instruct us to do this very thing *repeatedly*. Psalm 118:15 says, "Shouts of joy and victory resound in the tents of the righteous. . . ."

I am hesitant to lift my voice in praise and thanksgiving, or even jubilant singing, not because God isn't worthy, but because I fear the disapproval of man more than I love God. Or I love myself and my reputation more than I love God. Either way, I'm letting something inhibit my voice of praise that rightfully belongs to God. I'm worried about what the person next to me in worship will think if I let myself get fully involved in the act of worship. This is not the kind of worshipper I long to be.

What I love the best about God is that sometimes what he asks of us doesn't make sense, but when we follow through, the reward is great. Let us lift up our voices in praise, declaration, prayer, and singing and trust that we were created to do exactly that.

May God awaken a great love for Him in our hearts that causes us to abandon the cares of this world to jubilant praise for our Maker, Savior, Sustainer, and Redeemer.

Caring For People

THEY ASKED JESUS

Looking for a summer task to do at the lake or sitting by the pool? How about looking up all the references in the Bible to those persons identified as "they." I tried this and do you know what I found in the most complete Biblical Concordance. . . the words "See Preface."

Now you can imagine my surprise at this directive. The concordance, The New Strong's Exhaustive Concordance, that I borrowed from Pastor Todd's office, with his permission of course, is the most complete of the concordances available. It was originally published in 1890, but revised and updated in 1990. The New Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible was the result of Dr. James Strong's thirty five years of scholarly research. You would think someone would have been able to identify these persons known only as "they."

The "they" mentioned by Luke did something that I would suggest gives us direction for our caring ministry. "They," according to Luke 5:38, "asked Jesus to help her." The "her" was the mother-in-law of the disciple Peter.

The whole story is this: Jesus went to the home of Peter. Upon arriving, the guests discovered that Peter's mother-in-law had a high fever. 'They' "asked Jesus to help her." And as Luke tells the story Jesus "bent over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. She got up at once and began to wait on them."

Who are the "they" in Cedar Hills Community Church who ask Jesus to help those in need?

"They" are those individuals who spend time in prayer using the bulletin insert as a guide. Each week, the bulletin lists names of those who need prayers and sometimes groups of people who have needs. "They" ask Jesus to help service personnel, missionaries, those in hospitals, various staff persons, and groups within the church.

"They" are those individuals who read their prayer request e-mails and see prayer requests from Pastor Kent and others asking us to pray for particular individuals or events.

"They" are those individuals who read the Prayers from Doc and follow through by praying for different groups of people.

I believe there are a whole lot of people called "they" in our congregation and I know God is pleased by their actions. Are you someone called "they" ? If you are, I thank God for you just as I imagine Peter's mother-in-law thanked the "they" who asked Jesus to help her.
