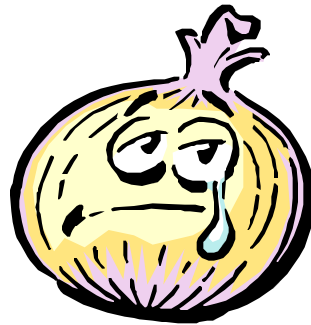

Reflections with Kent . . .

I fee like I have been an emotional wreck lately. Doesn't take much to set me to weeping. And I am not sure how I feel about that.

My mother-in-law advised me to keep an onion sitting around to stave off the flu. It has come in handy when the unexpected visitor walks in to find me crying. "It's the onion," I say...

The writer Fredrick Buechner once said that it would help all of us if we would keep track of the times and events in our lives that bring tears to our eyes. They may be happy or sad moments. A funeral, a wedding, a birth, a patriotic event, a child's performance, a touching commercial, the first three minutes of the new Star Trek movie.



Whenever we are stirred to our depths we recognize God may be up to something. It can be in victory or in death. Check the times and places where you weep, said Buechner, and you will see the places God is getting through to you.

I think we should weep more freely. Weep for the love of God. Weep for the lost. Weep for the Haitians. Weep for the baby. Weep for the frightened. Weep for the lonely. Weep for the oppressed. Weep for the bride. Weep for the hungry. Weep for the unemployed. If we do not weep, I am afraid that God is not getting to us.

Sometimes we are so sophisticated that we are like a banker I heard about. He had one glass eye and one good eye and you could scarcely tell which was which. One of the tellers said, "If you go ask for a loan and you see a glimmer of sympathy in one of his eyes, you know it is the glass eye."

Are we unmoved by the plight of others or are we moved by the world around us? I suspect that if we are moved by the world around us then we are tuned into God and this will deepen us in new and unexpected ways. Might make us a bit weepy.

Weeping puts us in good company. Remember that simplest of all memory verses from John 11:35? "Jesus Wept." Jesus wept for his friend. Jesus wept for the city of Jerusalem. Jesus wept because God cares.

Be careful what you wish for as you become a disciple deeply rooted in Jesus. You might want to keep an onion handy.

Growing Deeper

We believe God is calling us as a congregation to Go Deep. This focus will shape our ministry for the next season of our congregations' life. We are **GROWING DISCIPLES DEEPLY ROOTED IN JESUS.**

We believe there are three movements through which Christ-followers grow and individuals at each movement need something different to grow best.

Those who are in Movement 1 are new believers and they grow best in corporate worship that highlights our fundamental beliefs in God.

Movement 2 consists of growing Christians who are deepened by personal Scriptural reflection.

Movement 3 is people who live Christ-centered lives and they are deepened through service.

Worship, scriptural reflection, and service are vital elements for all of us to pursue as we deepen our walk with Jesus.

Consistory News and Notes

We held our annual leadership retreat on January 16 which included Consistory, Staff, and Core Team Leaders. We celebrated our strengths, examined our weaknesses, and looked at the biggest opportunities that lie ahead. Some of the issues that Consistory hopes to address in 2010 include:

- Helping the Congregation go deeper.
- Evaluating structures and staff.
- Clarifying expectations for ministry teams.
- Improving communication strategies.
- Developing a consistent leadership voice.

The consistory also voted to amend the by-laws by changing the definition of a quorum of our annual meeting from "one fifth of our adult membership" to members "present" at the meeting. A second amendment removed the requirement of a double slate for the election of elder's and deacons. These amendments both passed the first reading.

We named the assumptions we will use as we begin our staff evaluation. They include:

- We want staff to serve according to gift and calling.
- We staff according to the identified need of CHCC.
- We expect results from the staff.
- We want to staff for growth.

We will be moving to fill the Office Manager position as soon as possible. We are evaluating the Director of Ministry Development position before taking any action in replacing that position.

As always we appreciate your prayers.

Consistory News and Notes Continued

Patience and Prayers Please

Our staff has recently experienced some big changes. We are currently functioning with 60+ hours less of staff time than just one month ago. This staff turnover comes at a time when ministry is running full steam ahead and it is the kind of rapid change that will require some significant adjustments.

Here are some of the ways we are responding:

1. We will be seeking to hire an office manger as soon as possible.
2. We are evaluating the Director of Ministry Development position to determine how best to proceed.
3. We are seeking volunteers to assist in the office to carry out day-to-day duties.
4. We will attempt to cover responsibilities to the best of our abilities in the short-term as staff and volunteer time is available

While we would like to have a seamless transition we recognize that it is not possible to fill every gap that may be identified and we ask for your patience and prayerful support of our dedicated staff and volunteer team. CHCC is a very active place and we are here to support and equip the congregation to continue impactful ministry.

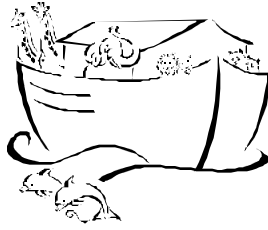

January was a very cold month but we still had a lot of fun at preschool! We began testing all our 4-year-old classes.

Testing is presented in a game format and is done on a one-on-one basis with the teacher. Most children really enjoy the time with their teacher. Once testing is over, the teachers will send out a final progress report. The each family will decide if Alternative Kindergarten or Kindergarten is best for their child.

Our 3-year-old classes focused on spatial concepts, shapes, daytime/nighttime and pockets. The younger classes have come a long way since September!

Our 2010-2011 enrollment is underway and classes are filling up nicely. The morning four-year-old class is full. We still have some openings in the afternoon. Two of the morning three-year-old classes are full also. Spots are still available in the morning as well as the afternoon. Parents, when was the last time you said:

- "That's just the way things are"
- "It will work itself out"
- "Things are just different these days"

As a parent you are the primary source of faith to your children. Have you as a parent set the bar too low? If your children are eating enough, generally physically healthy, passing in school, and are content with their life, are you doing a good job as a parent.....stop and ask yourself: Where do I get my standard to measuring how well I'm doing as a parent?

- From the society I live in
- From the way my family/friends raise their kids
- From the standards my parents set
- From the bible
- From my church

Here's a question or two to think about:

- What role do you think God and the Bible should have in setting the standards by which you access your effectiveness as a parent?
- Do you know anything about the guidance the Bible gives to parents about children and families?

Describe your children with regard to the following:

- How sensitive is my child to violence? How does he/she respond when seeing it on TV?
- How important is it to my child that he/she has "new" stuff?
- How respectful is my child to me? To other adults? To other children?
- How many hours of electronic media does my child consume in a week?

Take some time to think and pray about your children. What kind of a human being do you want them to become? Are you more interested in their profession, their income, or a passion for God and honesty? Much of the emotional stability and maturity of our children stems from their relationship with their family. The most important aspect of every person's life is his or her spiritual health.

Discipleship Ministries

A Guiding Philosophy

Let's go Deep. Perhaps you have heard this talked about around church the past two months. We are just getting started into a new year where the vision is for our congregation to grow deeper in our walk with Jesus. The vision is that if we were to assess the congregation at the end of 2010 we would be able to see marks of how each of us has deepened our faith. It seems that making a clear proclamation of what it means to be deep and what isn't is necessary.

At our staff meeting this month we talked about the need for us to know as a body what it looks like for us to be maturing Christians. We have been working with an understanding of what it means to be a mature Christian from a large study conducted by Willow Creek called the Reveal Study. This study discovered that there are clear movements in our faith walk. The movement from a Christian to a mature Christian was marked by the amount of time you spent in God's word. This was the main way of growth. This means if we only engage in our faith walk during Sunday morning worship we will be an infant Christian (Hebrews 5: 11-14) our entire life. It will take action from us in God's Word that will bring about maturity and help us move in our faith walk.

In the Discipleship Core Area, we have been working on coming up with a guiding philosophy for our ministries. The goal is to use this philosophy as a guide for the discipleship ministries to be purposeful and help the congregation mature in our faith. We believe that our discipleship ministries will be engaged in Transformational Discipleship that will be carried out through Scriptural Teaching; Relationships; and Renewal.

It is our hope that by being a part of a ministry in the Discipleship Core Area that you will be deepened. We hope that you will experience Transformational Discipleship through Scriptural Teaching; Relationships; and Renewal.

Worship Ministries

Last month we began the journey of looking at what deep worship is like and learned that deep worship involves choosing to worship by making a conscious decision within ourselves to sing, speak, and listen with a sincerity that recognizes God for who He truly is. This is a heart issue.

We can also choose to worship God with our minds, by understanding with clarity what we are singing and speaking. We sing in the hymn, *The Solid Rock*, "dressed in His righteousness alone, faultless to stand before the throne."

What does it mean to be dressed in righteousness? And why am I dressed in righteousness *alone*? These are the kinds of questions we want our minds to be asking as we sing. Our worship can't be mere words thoughtlessly recited from our lips. It has to be words mixed with understanding mixed with a conscious intent to raise them in Truth to our glorious God.

There are many times I'll be studying Scripture and find words that are the lyrics to my favorite songs. It's amazing how quickly song lyrics sink into our memory when paired with melody. We're very careful to choose music for Sundays that speaks only truth and uses Scripture appropriately. There are popular worship songs out there that we will not use for this reason alone. If I'm to go deeper in my worship by worshiping God with my mind, I want to worship Him in Truth, even in the form of Truth repeated over and over again.

As we seek to go deeper in the year ahead as a church, let's go deeper in our worship as well. It cannot be a sacrifice of praise without a cost. It shouldn't always come easy. Sometimes it comes with great concentration and devotion and hardship, but the reward is great.

Lord, won't you come and show us where we have formed walls around our minds that keep us from engaging deeper with You in worship. Show us those places where we have let false notions of worship come into play, and replace them with Your desire to see Your people worship You in spirit and in truth. In Jesus' name, amen.

The caring that makes our congregation special is that we care because Christ cared enough to come into this world, died on a cross for us and was seen alive three days later by His disciples.

When we care because of Christ's care we are not looking for praise. We are not looking to be seen by others. We care because deep within us is the knowledge that Christ cares for us. Our congregational value is that everyone should feel they are cared for by someone. No one should feel they are outside the care of someone.

This care is many times needed when a member or family member goes to the hospital. To care for them there is a Team whose mission is to visit those who go to the hospital.
