## Reflecting with Kent . . .

Daily I hear stories of new ways that God impacts lives. One very exciting new story comes from the Church Multiplication Team. They envision that in 2010 CHCC will embark on a journey toward birthing a new church. Here is a part of this multiplication story.

Our story begins 50 years ago in the DNA of a congregation started to reach the neighborhood of Cedar Hills. The multiplication vision is born out of a legacy of proclaiming the Gospel to reach those who do not know Christ.

Church planting raises memories of New Song which was our first taste of church planting. CHCC grew through many challenges and now recognizes lessons learned from New Song:

- Starting from health and from strength is very important.
- Gaining widespread congregational support is vital.
- Reaching lost people is messy but rewarding.
- Partnering with the mother church offers a better path for planting.

In recent years the RCA has been casting the vision of church planting being accomplished by healthy congregations engaged in multiplying themselves. In 2005, the RCA's Multiplication Team began to identify "Bright Light" congregations within the RCA as those churches best suited to multiply themselves. CHCC was identified as one of the "Bright Light" congregations in the RCA.

After years of prayerful consideration, some in our congregation now feel called to church planting. In 2008

our Church Multiplication Team convened for the first time with this charter from the consistory: **Discern if God is calling us to plant a new church.** More than a dozen leaders began this journey. After months of prayer, discernment, meetings, study, interviews, and conversation it was determined that **we are being called to plant a new church.** Several defining moments came in these months of study:

1. New churches are the most effective way to reach lost people in our culture. This is the main reason why we would pursue a church plant.
2. We are called not just to plant a church but to begin a movement of church multiplication. This is a journey that could birth many churches.
3. This is a spiritual mission. We are in a battle for the hearts and souls of people, engaging an enemy hell bent on destroying people. This is about bringing spiritual resources into a battle to reach people.

By early 2009 the team identified a target area for this church plant as being south of Highway 30 and East of I-380. Of the many models of planting studied, it was determined that the satellite-to-plant model fit best. (What is initially one church in two locations becomes two churches in two locations.) Shortly after that the message came loud and clear that the target for the first satellite service should be 10/10/10 @10:00AM.

Since that time the work of this team has escalated and the pace is quickening as the team follows God is leading on this multiplication journey. These are just the highlights of what has already been an amazing story. More is yet to come.

## Growing Deeper

We believe God is calling us as a congregation to Go Deep. This focus will shape our ministry for the next season of our congregations' life. We are **GROWING DISCIPLES DEEPLY ROOTED IN JESUS**. We see growth in at least three steps:

Movement 1 is new believers and they grow best in corporate worship that highlights our fundamental beliefs in God.

Movement 2 consists of growing Christians who are deepened by personal Scriptural reflection.

Movement 3 is people who live Christ-centered lives and are deepened through service.

We are now seeking ways to measure this growth.

## Consistory News and Notes

Our February consistory meeting started with meditation on God's providence. We recognized God's hand upon us and upon our congregation and offered prayers of celebration for God's wonderful guidance and his faithful provision.

We talked about measurements and assessment tools as we move to implementing strategies to go deep as a congregation. We are attempting to answer the question "How will we know if disciples at CHCC are deeply rooted in Jesus?" The Consistory, staff, and adult discipleship team are all working to explore possible tools to help in this assessment.

We approved the HR Team recommendation to pursue a full-time Office Administrator. This is a position that will combine selected duties from the former Office Coordinator and Director of Ministry Development positions. A job description is available in the office upon request. We also approved the job description and the hiring plan. We hope to have this new position filled as quickly as possible. We further authorized the hiring of temporary staff to help with custodial duties in the weeks while Paul Donnan recovers from surgery.

We approved updates and cleared up language in the by-laws of CHCC to allow for a single slate in our election of elders and deacons and to update the definition of a quorum.

We also approved the Church Multiplication Team's recommendation to begin a satellite service on 10/10/10 with the ultimate goal of planting a new church on the south side of Cedar Rapids. We are excited about the opportunity for outreach and thrilled with their passion and plan. We will be seeking additional information as it becomes available about the use of RCA Church Planting money and a more detailed outlook for 2011. 2010 funding is already in place in the mission's budget. The Multiplication Team is empowered to move forward with this mission.

As you can see it was a full but exciting meeting—thanks for the prayers. (And keep praying.)

# What is Church Multiplication?

## *What is Church Multiplication?*

Church multiplication is not just about planting a new church so that one church becomes two. It is about congregations following the call to reproduce themselves over and over again so that churches are multiplied. Here are some of the thoughts driving CHCC's Multiplication Team:

1. New churches are the most effective way to reach those who do not know Christ. Multiplication is about reaching lost people.
2. Multiplication is a spiritual mission requiring spiritual resources. We are in a battle for the hearts and souls of people, engaging an enemy hell bent on our destruction. God calls us to engage in this battle.
3. God wants us to step out in faith by launching a satellite location in the fall of 2010. (10/10/10). And we believe that if this succeeds our only explanation will be that we were riding the wave of God's calling and blessing.
4. Our mission is to reach unchurched people. Our expectation is to reach out so that 25% of those who participate will be coming from an unchurched background.
5. The success of this as an outreach depends on two things:
  - a. God is mighty to save and will work through this effort.
  - b. We are connecting relationally to people in that community.
6. The following spiritual resources will be essential to carry out this mission:
  - a. God
  - b. People
  - c. Prayer Warriors
  - d. Knowledge
  - e. Purpose
  - f. Courage
  - g. Wisdom
  - h. Revelation/Vision
  - i. Faith
  - j. Support
  - k. Discernment/guidance
  - l. Righteousness
  - m. Gospel
  - n. Patience
  - o. Hope
  - p. Unity

- q. Glory to God
- r. Testimony
- s. Love—both within our group and toward others

7. Church multiplication comes with costs and risks that will need to be addressed. Here are some of the risks involved:
  - a. Spiritual warfare
  - b. Messy lives – lots of need
  - c. A lot of work – burnout
  - d. Finances
  - e. Congregational support/ownership
  - f. Unknown risks
  - g. Communication
  - h. Inexperience
  - i. Pressure
  - j. Community may not accept a new church
8. Church multiplication is a unique opportunity to impact our community in new ways so that people are introduced to Christ.

## Ministry Management Team

Each winter for the last decade I have picked out one of the 1000+ piece puzzles that I was given as a gift and spread it out on our dining room table. I usually spend about a month putting it together, an hour here and there. This year I have yet to do this, since as a new elder I'm not finding that extra time.

But it occurred to me the other day that being more of a part of what goes on at CHCC can be a little like putting all the pieces of a puzzle together. Right now I'm still in the process of turning over all the pieces before I start to fit them all together.

When I volunteered to be the consistory representative on the Ministry Management Team, it was also suggested that I be the new CMC person, which I found out stands for Consistory Member in-Charge. I could hardly wait to find out – in charge of what? I later was told that the CMC was “in charge” of gathering the great stories of the many CHCC ministries and communicating them to the consistory and the congregation.

At the Ministry Management meeting in January, I listened to the Core Leaders share about the Teams they are responsible for. I realized the immensity of the CHCC puzzle and the amount of hours of ministry that take place in our church. Here are a few of the stories:

I found out that I am not the only one excited about “Going Deep”, our overall church theme for 2010. Already there is evidence for this in the Sunday church services, specifically in Kent's preaching which is challenging us to new depths in our faith adventure. Also, perhaps you have also noticed that the song leading groups are seeking more depth in their Sunday presentation with the inclusion of more prayer, scripture references, instruments, and pure heart.

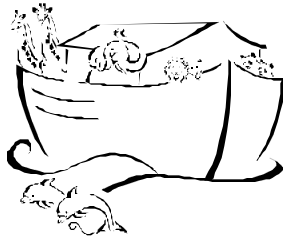
Another great story shared in the meeting was about our Open Hands Food Pantry. In a phone call to Jodi Joslin, I found out more about this increased excitement. She gave me some numbers for 2009 that were amazing: \$10,000 in financial support above and beyond the budgeted amount, tons of food donated, 2500 visits to the pantry, and a total of 75 volunteers. And something new – a refrigerator/freezer that is making it possible to handle perishables such as frozen meats, fruit and dairy products. Lisa Boldt says, “I love the Open Hands ministry primarily because it is a way of directly reaching out and serving others. I love the chance to meet the clients, hear their stories, and then provide them some assistance.”

Bruce Boldt, Core Leader of the resource team says, “I had been praying for some guidance on how to help the Resource team become more connected to the ministries of the church and less of a ‘business-oriented’ team. Prior to talking to anyone in the church about this, Doc gave me some information he had been reading about the church facilities being an enabler to ministries. The information was very helpful and I truly believe this was God's way of answering my prayers.” How great is that?

I do believe that all the pieces of the great CHCC puzzle do come together easier and give glory to God when the teams responsible for carrying out the mission of CHCC have the prayer support of the congregation. You can be a part of that at the next church prayer time sponsored by the prayer team on March 7 at 2pm.

The Children's Ministry Teams have adopted a new acronym to help in their walk with our children. If anybody asks what we are doing with our students, we will respond with, "Training them."

"**TRAIN**", based from the Proverbs 22:6 passage that states, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." is helpful for teachers to:

- T**=*teach* from the Bible
- R**=assist children to build a strong *relationship* with God and other believers
- A**=bring children to *accept* Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior
- I**=direct students to *invest* their time in service to God because they believe
- N**=help children come *nearer* to God in worship

Our job is to walk alongside parents to lead their children to develop a habit of "loving God" through prayer, Bible study, service, and various other disciplines. "Children's Ministers" use common-experiences and "everyday" happenings as a TRAINing ground to grow our children.

Joy – what an interesting word. It is short, but its meaning is deep. It is a word that can have immense impact on our day, week, month, year, and I don't think that is being overdramatic. Think about the word Joy. Have you felt it today, this week, this month? In the midst of our everyday life our days can be void of Joy. The grind of a busy, complicated life at times seems to be full of joylessness, not Joy.

It seems that God knew our lives at times would be far from joyful. When you begin to look through scripture you see that God is concerned about our joy. John 15:11 says, “I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.” 1Thessalonians 5:16 says, “Be joyful always.” God is so concerned that we have joy in our lives that he actually commands us to be joyful. It is a good reminder of how we should strive to live our lives. Having joy at times is a matter of choosing to have a different attitude about a situation we are in. Other times we need to share our concerns with others so that they can help us bring joy into our day.

Each month the Youth Ministries of SUMMIT and LINK have an event with the purpose to bring joy to the lives of students. We do it in a variety of ways: going bowling, playing water games, having Murder Mystery parties, concerts, or game nights just to name a few. On the outside looking in, it might look like we are just messing around with students, but it is so much deeper and important than that. Students today live lives at such a demanding pace that there is little time for them just to have a time of joy.

Study after study keeps coming out about how high-strung, high-stressed, and busy students are today and the trend continues to increase. Students have little time to just be kids. The next time you see us clowning around, playing games, having all sorts of fun hopefully you will think—oh, they must be having a **Joy** night at youth group tonight.

## Worship Ministries

A few of the worship teams have taken on the practice of discussing the weekly sermon outline before they lead the rest of the congregation in worship. I don't think it is a big mystery or secret that God moves when His people are focused on the things of His heart. The greatest revivals of history were sparked by believers regularly coming together in prayer, focusing on asking God for revival. There is strength in asking for the things that are already on God's heart. There is strength in being focused together on God. God's heart is to save lost people, so prayers for lost people are something God delights to answer because they are *already* on his heart.

I am moved by the Scripture that describes David as “a man after God's own heart.” I've often thought that meant David was a great pursuer of the love of God. But maybe it was more than that. Maybe David was a pursuer of the things that God had *on His heart*. And if something is on God's heart, I want it on my heart, too. If God cares about something, I want it to be top priority in my life. If He doesn't care for something, I don't want to waste my time with it. I want to *be* and *do* what's on God's heart.

Lent is a season of preparation, to seek after the things of God's heart, and to cleanse us of the things that aren't on His heart. Sin is not on God's heart. Worldly principles aren't on God's heart. Storing up treasures on Earth is not on God's heart. Scripture shows us a great multitude about the heart of God. The principles of His Kingdom reveal His heart, the greatest being the Sermon on the Mount. I'm amazed how different the principles of my life can be from the principles of my God.

As we seek the Lord in this season, let's seek the things that are on His heart. Let's set our hearts and minds on Him, because it is His desire that we do just that!

Worshiping Him is on His heart. And if it's on His heart, it is good.

1. Invest some time every day praying for people. Use the Bulletin Insert. Use the *Go Deep* Section of the Bulletin. Use the Church's Picture Directory. Jot down people you read about in the newspaper or see on television. Whatever the resources you use...invest some time every day praying for people.
2. Invest some time each week reading the weekly bulletin and praying for activities that are scheduled for that week. The Youth Groups, the worship teams, the Church School teachers and the Small Groups all need your prayers. You might also pray for the outside groups that use our facilities such as the Scouts and Alcohol Anonymous.
3. Invest some time asking God to show you where you might serve others in ways you are not presently serving. Each of us has gifts and those gifts are needed by some group or individual in the church.

So much about the investment...  
How about the RETURN?

I like these words of Mother Teresa: "I pray that you will understand the words of Jesus, 'Love one another as I have loved you.' Ask yourself 'How has He loved me? Do I really love others in the same way?' She added: 'Unless this love is among us, we can kill ourselves with work and it will only be work, not love. Work without love is slavery.'"

What's our ROI? In one sentence, it is to know the love of Jesus Christ. That is the greatest RETURN ON INVESTMENT in this life.
